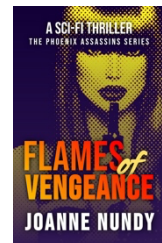


Joanne Nundy author of *Flames of Vengeance*

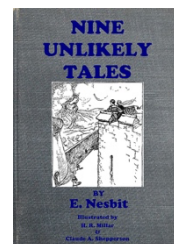

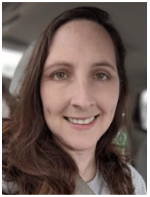
